

## Govt aims at welfare

Dhaka and Narayanganj district was a step forward in this regard.

He said five primary schools were being set up in Dhaka and two in Narayanganj for the education of the underprivileged children who work in factories and workshops in the capital and around Narayanganj town.

The President said it was not an isolated initiative but the beginning of a programme which would spread all-over the country with the passage of time. In this context, he hoped that the affluent sections of the society would come forward from all-over the country to join those from Dhaka and Narayanganj who had already showed their generosity to set up schools for the distressed children so that they could stand on their own feet.

Referring to the survey of child workers made by the Adhikar Trust, the President said this survey had greatly revealed their plight. He said after the school at Pagla was completed, it would be run by the Adhikar Trust. The Trust was also given the charge of handling the accounts of the child workers whose employers had agreed with him to provide some extra wages to the child workers to be deposited in banks, he said adding: the money thus accumulated in their account would be given back to them after completion of their education so that they could do something with the sum to improve their lot.

President Ershad said we all love our country but regretted that a handful of persons had been trying to lower the image of the country by telling imaginary stories.

### Religious harmony

He said people of all religious communities had been living in harmony in Bangladesh for a long time and would continue to do so in future also. He said our biggest identity is that we all are Bangladeshis and that is what we believe in our heart.

The President urged the people to remain on guard against those who had been trying to spread the venom of communalism to disturb the existing communal harmony in the country.

President Ershad said his government had effected many a reforms for the welfare of the people and said if peace and discipline could be maintained in the country, there would be greater development improving the condition of the common people.

He said side by side with the development of agriculture sector, the government had put emphasis on the setting up of more industries in all parts of the country to create greater opportunities of employment.

The President called upon all to come forward to extend their hands of cooperation to achieve these noble objectives and said if peace and discipline could be maintained it would not be an impossible task to achieve greater development in the country.

President Ershad received an on the spot donation of Taka 12 lakh and 10 thousand from the donors of Dhaka and Narayanganj districts.

### Hajee Danesh college

Another report adds:—Country's third agricultural college in Dinajpur in commemoration of late Hajee Mohammad Danesh will be formally inaugurated by President Hussain Muhammad Ershad in October this year, a PID Press release said.

This was disclosed on Thursday in a review meeting on "establishment of Hajee Mohammad Danesh Agricultural College" held in the Agriculture Ministry with its Minister Major Gen. (Retd) Mahmudul Hasan in the chair.

Chairman, Dinajpur District Council, Mr. Mokhlesur Rahman, MP, Agriculture Secretary M.A. Syed and other high officials of the ministry were present in the meeting.

The meeting decided that 60 students will be enrolled initially in early October this year and admission test in this connection will be conducted simultaneously in Dhaka and Dinajpur.

The meeting discussed various aspect of development of this college.

The proposal for setting up of Hajee Danesh Agricultural College at Basherhat, Dinajpur was enunciated by President Ershad.
