

## Narail Women's College now smarting under various problems

NARAIL Dec 31:—Narail Women's Government College is facing shortage of teachers which has been causing obstacles to the studies of the students.

At the initiative of Md. Abdul Latif the then Deputy Commissioner, Narail Government Women's College was established on February 2, 1986 and there after it was nationalised on March 1, 1999.

The Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education Jessore affiliated the college and permitted the students to appear at the HSC Examinations in 1992.

The college has been facing manifold problems like shortage of teachers, lack of library facility, furniture canteen facilities, play ground games and sports laboratory facility and scientific appliances since long. Besides, illegal occupation of the college land by the adjacent land-owners has been a vital factor by the very nose of the civil administration here.

More than 100 girls read in the college in Humanities, Science and Commerce Groups in Intermediate stage. There are 21 posts of teachers including that of Principal, the posts in

Bengali, English, Economics, Civics, Logic, Gen. History, Islamic History in Humanities group, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Biology in Science Group and three Demonstrators in the laboratories respectively and Accountancy, Geography, Management, Economics and the posts of Physical Instructor and Librarian. There are two Class III employees and five Class IV employees in the college.

All the posts of teaching are Lecturers except that Principal and two posts of Assistant Professor of Bengali and English Physical Instructor and Librarian have been lying vacant for long time.

The Principal incharge Mrs. Azizzunnesa has requested the Ministry of Education and Director of Higher Education to fill up the vacant posts immediately to remove the acute problems of the learners.

The college has no Play Ground, sufficient furniture, science apparatus and canteen facility in the college campus causing suffering to the students and teaching staff as well as other employees.
