

BCL calls off strike in DU

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) led six student organisations on Monday called off its indefinite strike in the Dhaka University.

Classes of the university will resume today (Tuesday) after thirty-five days of closure.

The decision was taken at an emergency meeting at its central office at Bangabandhu Avenue on Monday with BCL President Liaquat Sikder chairing it.

BCL and the left leaning organisations decided to withdraw the strike following a fruitful dialogue with the university authorities.

The leaders of BCL and others six left leaning student organisations held talks with Vice Chancellor Prof. SMA Faiz at his office on Monday noon.

Standing Committee was held at the VC lounge, where the authorities directed all Hall provost to take necessary steps for ensuring coexistence in all the dormitories.

According to sources, a large number of BCL leaders and activists returned to their respective dormitories on Monday in presence of Hall authorities and leaders of Jatlyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD).

Sources said, the university authorities assured the BCL leaders and activists that their five point demands would be met very soon.

However, the first day of the indefinite period strike called by BCL led six student organisations was observed peacefully on the Dhaka University campus on Monday.
