Pry teachers to gherao PM's office today

Non-government Primary School Teachers Association, whose members begun 'fast unto death' since Tuesday demanding nationalization of their jobs, has extended their ultimatum till 11 am Thursday for meeting their demand, reports UNB.

If the one-point nationalization demand is not met by the deadline, the teachers will march to-

wards the Prime Minister office to lay a siege there, said the Association leaders.

The Association earlier threatened to lay siege to the Prime Minister's office after 11 am on Wednesday.

Twenty-two non-government primary school teachers, from across the country are taking part in the 'fast unto death' program

while many others are staging sit-in to press for their demand, both at the central Shaheed Minar premises.

Two of the fasting teachers—Aftabuddin Gopal of Kishoreganj and Aminur Rahman of Nilphamari—fell sick Wednesday afternoon and were given saline.
