

BM College to be full-fledged university soon: Biswas

President Abdur Rahman Biswas on Thursday held but an assurance that the Barisal Government Brojamohan University College. Inshallah, would be turned into a full fledged university in near future, reports BSS.

The President was talking to a 30-member delegation of principal, Vice-Principal, heads of department and professors of the college when they called on him at Bangabhaban on Thursday. The delegation was led by Prof Mohammad Shahsjahan Khan, Principal of the college.

In a memorandum, the members of the delegation apprised the President that the BM University College has been teaching 19 Masters courses and 17 Honours courses in different subjects and asserted that since there is no University in southern region, there is every justification for raising this college into a full-fledged university.

They demanded creation of posts of the teachers and Class III and IV employees, expansion of residential hostels, modernisations of the auditorium and arrangement of transports for the teachers and the students. They informed the President that there is no violence terrorism in the college and a peaceful and congenial atmosphere has been existing for serious academic atmosphere has been existing for serious academic pursuit.

President Biswas said that althrough his life, he gave preference to education which can alone make a nation enlightened and economically self-reliant and prosperous. Investment for education has always been very rewarding and because of higher rate of literacy the South-East Asian and Far Eastern countries have made tremendous progress today, he added.

The President said that there is no reason to suffer from any inferiority complex as a nation adding that our students are making brilliant results abroad, doctors and engineers are rated very high as compared to their counterparts from other countries for their excellent performance.

Continuing President Biswas said that even our soldiers working in UN peace-keeping missions abroad for safeguarding democracy in

other countries are also praised for their devoted services. We have gas and other natural resources waiting for full exploitation for the benefit of the nation, he said, adding that we must prosper in no time and compete with other developing countries.

President Biswas called upon the teachers to project to the students manifold potentials of the country and of themselves in correct perspective, so that they do not suffer from any complex.
