On the occasion, all classes will be suspended. But the scheduled examinations will be held accordingly and the offices will remain open. The academic activities of the university will resume from July 2, after the month-long summer vacation.

The celebration will begin at 9.30am with a discussion to be held at the Teacher-Student Centre (TSC) on the campus. Former Vice-chancellors, teachers, students and their guardians as well as elite will attend the function.

DU VC will lead the DU day rally from the TSC at 11.00am. DU Treasurer and convenor of the DU Day celebration committee Prof. Syed Abul Kalam Azad will preside over the discussion.

To mark the day, two friendly soccer matches will be held on the DU playground at 4 pm. VC Eleven will take on DU Alumni Association (DUAA) President Eleven in the first match while the former students will play against the present students in the second one.

Special lunch will be served in the hall canteens and messes from 1.00pm to 2.00pm.
