

Govt to establish tech schools in UZs: Nahid

BIANIBAZAR (Sylhet), July 16: The government will set up one technical school in each upazila to build up skilled manpower. Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid said here Thursday, reports UNB.

Six-month-long short course will be introduced in class six to ten in the proposed schools alongside technical education, he said while exchanging views at a workshop on this subject at Bianibazar Upazila complex auditorium.

Nahid said a workshop will be organized to hold a brainstorming discussion on adequate number of students, what could be the technical trades, feasibility of short

course and job prospect of the students on completion of the course.

Chairman of Technical Education Board Prof Abul Kashem, Director General of Technical Education Directorate Prof Nitai Chandra Sutradhar, Chief Planning Officer of the Education Ministry Nurul Haq and Sylhet Education Board Chairman SM Abdul Khaleque were present.

The Education Minister said 120 students in two sections from class six to ten will be admitted into these technical schools. "In each class a technical subject along with general curriculum will be introduced, excluding agriculture/home economics."
