

ICS plans to fight back possible BCL attack in CU

CHITTAGONG, May 30.—Chittagong University unit of the Islami Chhatra Shibir (ICS), student wing of the Jammāt-e-Islami, has reportedly adopted a new strategy to fight back the possible attacks from its arch rival and the student wing of the ruling party Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL).

The ICS men, according to the informed sources, started concentrating more on reinforcing the organizational strength from every possible ways including accumulation of firearms and ammunition.

Three decades of monopoly dominance on the campus and the administration of the university by the ICS has come under challenge when the Awami League led mega alliance took over power with absolute majority in December 29 general elections last year.

Many of the ICS workers believe that their organization is not only to lose command on the campus but also at the verge of extinction because of the adversities around.

The ICS reportedly formed

three squads — planning squad, steering squad and operation squad — at the secret meetings for keeping round-the-clock watch on the campus and the potential enemies.

Squads have been deployed at all strategically important points in and around the campus under the newly designed armament scheme and each of the squads is discharging the assigned duty in four shifts. Sophisticated and relatively long range firearms have

reportedly been supplied to the organization.
