

Pry education programme faces set-back in Madaripur

MADARIPUR, Feb. 3:—Universal primary education programme has been facing serious set-back in the district, local people said, reports UNB.

According to guardians, most of the primary schools are plagued with various problems including shortage of educational appliances, furniture and teachers.

Most of the government primary schools in the district have one or two teachers only who can teach upto Class III, they added.

Moreover, many schools damaged due to flood, cyclone and other

natural calamities over the last few years remained unrepaired hampering primary education seriously.

Many students of these schools are to attend their classes in the open and during the rainy season they are to undergo various problems to prosecute their studies.

Mentionable that there are no primary schools at the remote areas of the district.

Local leaders have urged the authorities to bring the remote areas within universal primary education programme and take immediate steps to repair and modernise the damaged the schools.
