

## Corruption will not be tolerate in free textbook printing process

Corruption will not be tolerated in the process of printing textbooks to be distributed at free of cost among the students from primary to secondary level in January next, reports BSS.

National monitoring committee for printing and distribution of free textbook for the students of primary and secondary level for the session 2010 staped this today while exchanging views with the journalists.

Convenor of the 16-member committee Prof Dr M Akhteruzzaman of Dhaka University addressed the

journalists at the auditorium of National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB).

Members of the committee Prof Syed Monjulul Islam of Dhaka University, NCTB Chairfman Prof Mustafa Kamal and Prof Aziz Ahmed Chowdhury, among others, were present.

The meeting suggested preventive monitoring for checking all sorts of delay and irregularities in the process of printing textbooks. millions of students are eagerly waiting for the textbooks.

Prof Akhteruzzaman said, in the light of last year's experiences, recommendations have been made to keep those suspected people under intelligence surveillance who might create hindrance in the process of printing, binding and distribution process of textbooks.

About free distribution of books, he said the government wants to provide education for all children and juveniles for building a digital Bangladesh.

He said process of printing about 21 cr books for the students from class one to ten is progressing gradually and NCTB is hopeful of delivering books to the district education officers by November 30.
