

RU classes resume

RAJSHAHI, June 1.—The academic activities of Rajshahi University resumed on Monday, 80 days after the closure, following a Shibir-Chhatra League clash that left a Shibir leader dead, reports UNB.

The classes resumed under strict disciplinary conditions, including a moratorium on campus politics, and heavy security deployment.

All the 16 residential halls of the university were re-opened Saturday.

The university authorities have banned all political activities, including holding meeting, drining out procession, distributing leaflets and pasting posters, on the campus until further notice.

Over 500 police have been deployed on the campus to thwart any untoward incident. Fifteen police guards have been posted in each dormitory for a round-the-clock watch.

The university authorities asked the residential and non-residential students to carry identity card during their stay on the campus.
