

Teachers lock up Islamic Univ admin building

Demand resignation of vice-chancellor

THE teachers of Islamic University in Kushtia locked up the administrative building on Monday, demanding removal of the vice-chancellor, pro vice-chancellor and treasurer, accusing them of doing 'recruitment trade' at the university.

Around 50 employees remained confined in the building as they locked it up for about one and a half

hours.

Another group of the agitating teachers also looked for the VC, M Alauddin, pro vice-chancellor M Kamaluddin and treasurer M Shajahan Ali on the campus but failed to find them as, according to sources, they did not come to the university on the day.

Around a hundred teachers then stage demonstration at the business faculty and sat in a meeting presided

over by the teachers' association senior vice-president Abu Sinha.

Speakers at the meeting called on the government to rescue the university from the ongoing deadlock by removing the three top officials.

Meanwhile, a large number of officials of the university led by deputy registrars ATM Emdadul Alam and Humayan Kabir, who is also secretary of IU offic-

ers' association, joined the teachers' meeting, expressing solidarity with their demands.

'We have declared solidarity with the teachers' demand and will abstain from work until the VC, pro vice-chancellor and treasurer leave their office,' Emdadul Alam told New Age.

The university's teachers' association has begun an indefinite work abstention on November 11.
