Anwar at a press conference at the Senate Hall said that students were not involved in any kind of

vandalism and blockade of the road and 'a third evil force was behind the chaos.'

He said that the six-member committee, headed by the pro-vice-chancellor, Farhad Hossain, began investigation and urged help from all.

Anwar said that the university authorities at a syndicate meeting would decide

whether they would file a case.

Anwar vowed to ensure congenial academic atmosphere on the campus as early as possible.

The press conference was also attended by the registrar, Abu Bakkar Siddque, the pro-vice-chancellor, the treasurer, Nasir Uddin, and several others senate members.

Three cases were filed over the violent clashes between students and the police on the campus and in neighbouring areas on Wednesday and Thursday after which the authorities closed the university.

The violence broke out after some unnamed people stabbed a student on Wednesday.
