

BUET teachers abstain from work

BANGLADESH University of Engineering and Technology teachers on Saturday abstained from work for two hours to push for the resignation of the vice-chancellor and the pro-vice-chancellor.

The BUET Teachers' Association went on the strike as part of its scheduled protests against the involvement of the vice-chancellor SM Nazrul Islam and the pro-vice-chancellor M Habibur Rahman in alleged irregularities in the administration during their tenure.

They condemned the probe report submitted to the syndicate on July 2 that had found no irregularity in the administration.

They vowed to continue with the strike for two hours every day till July 11 from 11:00am to 1:00pm.

Later, they bought out a silent procession that paraded the campus before ending at the Shaheed Minar at the institution.

The association's president Md Ashraful Islam said that they would go on full-hour strike after July 14 if their demands were not met by then.

He said that they had called off their previous strike on the assurance of the prime minister, Sheikh Hasina, on May 5.
