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5000 non-govt pry schools to be registered soon

GAIBANDHA, Aug 21: Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar has underscored the need for building literate and disciplined posterity to make the country happy and prosperous, reports BSS.

"Teachers have to play pioneering role in this regard keeping in mind that teaching is a mission not only an occupation", he said at a function here yesterday while inaugurating the new office building of district Primary Education Office Facilities Department constructed the building at a cost of Taka 19 lakh in nine months.

The Minister said five thousand non-government primary schools would be registered by the government soon and added that steps were underway to reconstruct and rehabilitate nine thousand schools throughout the country. Incentive would be provided to the teachers of all Non-government schools, he said.

"If we work unitedly to provide education through 71 thousand primary education institutions, being set up among the illiterate people of 68 thousand villages of the country, we could easily achieve the national target of

ensuring education for all the year 2000" he remarked.

Later, the Minister formally inaugurated the newly built Collegiate Government Primary School. Facilities Department had constructed the school at a cost of Taka 16 lakh where 500 children would be provided education.
