

## BCL INFIGHTING AT BAU Case filed against 150 BCL men

THE father of 12-year-old Rabbi who got caught in crossfire and killed in Chhatra League infighting at Bangladesh Agricultural University on Saturday filed a murder case on Sunday against more than 150 BCL activists.

The university authori-

ties have also set up a committee to investigate the clashes of the ruling Awami League's student organisation that forced the closure of the university for an indefinite period.

The death of the boy also prompted villagers to set fire to three halls and attack two more halls of the university.

The police said that Rabbi's father Dulal Mia had filed the murder case against more than 150 activists of the university unit Chhatra League. Twenty-five of the accused were named.

The accused include the Chhatra League now-dissolved unit's president Shamsuddin Al Azad and general secretary Rafiquzzaman Iman.

The central committee of the Chhatra League, however on Saturday, dissolved the university unit and expelled the two from the organisation.

None accused in the case was, however, arrested till Sunday evening.

The police on Saturday arrested four students at

campus over the infighting. The arrested are food engineering student Kaiser, resident of the Shamsul Haque Hall Joy, Fazhul Haque Hall resident Imran Sarker and Ashrafal Haque Hall resident Tarek.

The four-member committee, headed by crop botany professor Mustafizur Rahman, has assistant proctor Ziaul Haque, the provost council's convener Aslam and Lutfur Rahman as other members.

'We have set up a committee to investigate the incident,' the vice-chancellor Rafiqul Haque, said.

The post-mortem examination of Rabbi was, meanwhile, done in the Mymensingh Medical College

morgue on Saturday night. The body was handed over the family on Sunday.

Rabbi was buried in his family graveyard at Boira near the campus after the namaz-e-janaza in a local mosque.

The students have, meanwhile, vacated the halls as the university asked them to do.

The Ashrafal Haque Hall unit BCL president, Anwarul Haque, also a master's student of agronomy, was stabbed in the legs by some unnamed people near the main entrance to the university on Saturday evening when he was leaving the campus.

He was admitted to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital.
