



Project to enlighten madrasha students with IT

The British Council, Dhaka and Working for Better Life (WBL) have jointly undertaken a project to enlighten the madrasha students with Information Technology.

Aiming at reducing the gap between the students of modern educational system and the traditional ones, the two organisations have selected 16 madrashas across the country at the initial level of the project.

State Minister for Religious Affairs Mosharaf Hossain Shahjahan on Monday inaugurated the project titled "Bridging the Digital Divide" at the British Council auditorium on the Dhaka University campus. The British High Commissioner in Dhaka David Carter was present on the occasion.

About 200 madrasha students and teachers attended the programme to build their capacity in IT. The project will contribute to the process of inclusion of madrasha students in the orientation of technological development.

The project will provide total IT training to the students of all the 16 selected madrashas and later it would be extended to other madrashas of the country.

The State Minister for Religious Affairs appreciated the project and assured his total support to the project.
