



Transport strike in IU

ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY, Aug. 24:—The Islamic University (IU) remained closed yesterday (Saturday) as the university buses could not move from Kushtia and Jhenidah town for transport workers strike.

Sources said, Kushtia thana police arrested 9 transport workers from a club of the town on charge of gambling and displaying naked film on VCD and for antisocial activities on Friday night.

Two separate cases were filed against them.

The transport workers being angry with this, called transport strike on Kushtia town. All the motor vehicles including the IU buses could not move from Kushtia town. As a result the scheduled examinations of 8 departments and classes of the 18 departments of IU could not be held. The offices were closed.

Later the transport leaders withdrew the strike after a successful dialogue with the IU teachers and the police.
