IT jobs for Bangladeshis to be created in Japan

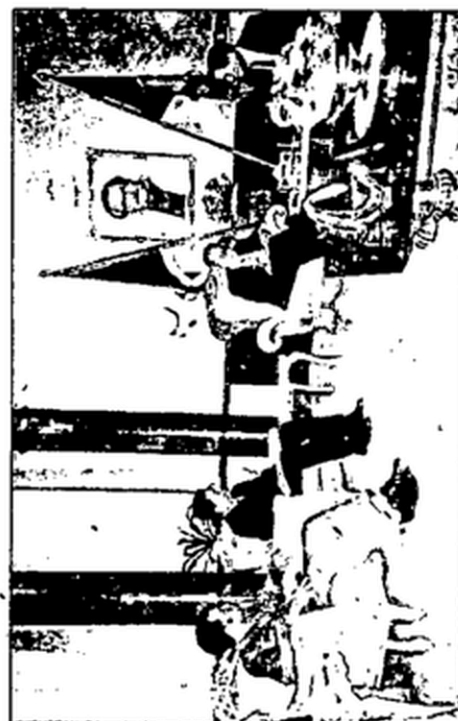
