

## Domar girls' school in grip of multiple problems for long

NILPHMARI, Dec 20:—The student of Domar Government Girls' High School have been suffering for want of adequate member of teachers and facing multifarious problems which have been hampering the imparting of education.

The school was established in 1960, nationalised in 1984, but education facilities have not yet been provided to seen school smoothly. There are provision for 12 teachers in the school for about 400 students, but only 7 teachers are at-present working in the school. There are no Head Mistress and Assistant Head Mistress for a long time in the school. There are no teachers in the Department of English and Science.

The old building of the school has become unfit for use. Rain water trickles through leakages. There are no Common Room and

Reading Room. A class room is also used for a library room. The library has no sufficient number of books.

There is no quarter for the Head Mistress and other teachers. The condition of the hostel is deplorable. As a result students can not stay there. The school has no auditorium for holding meeting and cultural functions. The school is facing shortage of furniture including sitting arrangements for the students.

There are no playing ground and sports instruments. There is a Science building, but no Laboratory Room and sufficient instruments for the Science students. There is no night guard and clerk in the school.

While contacted the authority of the school told me that the school have been facing a host of problems.
