

Khaleda's call to JCD workers

Make healthy trend in student politics

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia on Friday night asked the members of the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), students wing of BNP to work unitedly to create a healthy and fair trend in the country's student politics, maintain congenial academic atmosphere and make campuses terrorism free, reports BSS.
