Results of SSC exams presented to PM

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia Tuesday urged teachers, guardians and all concerned to take a formidable stand to eradicate unfair

means from all public examinations for rearing students as competent citizens, reports UNB.

She stressed improving standard of education in classrooms to help check the tendency of copying at exams and encourage tenderhearted students to cherish self-respect.

"Adopting unfair means in examinations is not desirable, students do not intend to suffer from this disgrace," she said talking

with the chairmen of country's nine education boards after this year's SSC exam results were published.

The chairmen called on the Prime Minister at her office in the afternoon and presented to her the statistics of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examination 2002 and Dakhil Examination 2002 of their respective boards.

Education Minister Dr Osman Faruk, State Minister Ehsanul Huq Milton, Deputy Minister Abdus Salam Pinto and Secretary M Shahidul Alam, chairmen of the country's seven Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards, Acting Chairman of Bangladesh Madrasha Education Board and Chairman-in-charge of Bangladesh Vocation Education Board were present on the occasion.

Appreciating the noble profession of teaching, the Prime Minister said the teachers through their commitment could build society in a good perspective and thereby attain self-contentment through their devotion to dissemination of education.

During the presentation of the exam statistics, the Education Minister informed the PM that various measures taken by the Ministry and all other concerned organizations before this year's examinations helped significantly reduce the propensity for adopting unfair means.

When the academics apprised the Prime Minister that the results of female students were encouraging, she asked them to ensure that the girls receive all the facilities provided by her government for expansion of female education.
