

## Help govt efforts for expansion of education: PM

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia Tuesday made a fervant appeal to all irrespective of party affiliation to help complement the government efforts for the expansion and development of education in the country, reports BSS.

"Today education is a national issue of us. We have to see education from national perspective. We believe, our initiatives would achieve success through our collective efforts. Our people would be educated, country turn into a self-reliant one and we as a nation would be able to stand on our own feet in the world atlas" she said.

The Prime Minister was addressing as chief guest the function marking the beginning of National Education Weeks, 1994 in Dhaka Tuesday morning at the Osmany Auditorium. She distributed prizes among students of different
