



International language instt to be set up: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on Thursday announced that an International Institute for Language and Culture would be established for researchers to study languages, including Bengali that earned world recognition, reports UNB.

She unveiled the government decision at a national-level meeting that chalked out elaborate programme to celebrate the newly declared International Mother Language Day through fortnight-long function.

UNESCO recently declared 21st February as International Mother Language Day recognising Bengali nation's language movement in 1952. Like other UN Days, this Day will be observed around the world.

The meeting, presided over by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, decided to start the celebrations from December 7.

Prime Minister Hasina will be present at the discussion meeting and later lead the march towards Shaheed Minar where she will lay a floral wreath at the altar of the language martyrs' memorial on behalf of the nation. The celebrations would continue till 21st February.
