

ban in BUET protested

The Engineering University Central Students' Union (EUCSU) and different student organisations on Tuesday protested against the suspension of the student unions and embargo on student politics on the BUET campus.

Blasting on the authorities' decision of suspending of activities, the EUCSU termed the decision simply out of jurisdiction of the Academic Council as per the BUET Ordinance 1962.

"The decision was taken deliberately to divert the reality towards a different course to continue the unusual situation prevailing on the campus, said an EUCSU statement signed by its General Secretary Hasib Mustabshir.

A vested quarter is trying to undermine the EUCSU before the nation involving it in the killing of Sabequn Nahar Sony, the EUCSU statement said and demanded immediate publication of the probe-body's report.

The EUCSU demanded exemplary punishment to all those responsible for the Sony killing and the incidents took place as its backlash. It demanded resumption of classes on August 3 at any cost.

Protesting the government's move to ban student politics and the embargo on BUET campus, left leaning Samajtantrik Chhatra Front (SCF), Bangladesh Chhatra Union (SCF) and Awami League-backed Bangladesh Chhatra

League (BCL) demonstrated the Dhaka University campus the day.

After a huge procession campus, Samajtantrik Front held a rally at the Shaheed Minar. When the procession was passing through M Canteen, activists and irrespective of any organ applauded it. Interestingly,ists of ruling party's student Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal gave their support to the procession.

The authorities used the notice issued during the Ayub Khan to ban student politics on the BUET campus which the students and teachers came out on the streets in the leaders said.

Sony was killed in the gap between two factions of the party's student wing and BUET authorities, government machinery were thoroughly informed of the confrontation leaders said added that ban on student politics on the campus nothing but the authorities' attempt to ignore its failure.

The BCL leaders and supporters held a rally at DUCSU hall on DU campus demanding immediate withdrawal of the embargo imposed on BUET campus.

The leaders termed the authorities' decision an act of banning student politics enacting law. They vowed to resist any such attempt.

Meanwhile, forty top rank former student leaders in a statement condemned the government's decision of banning student politics.

The government was out to curb student politics in the name of curbing terrorism but the incidents they were showing as excuse were just inner conflict of student front, the leaders said. Government high-ups are directly involved in those incidents patronising the terrorists, the former student leaders said.
