



## DU V-C at last admits indecent behaviour with female students

Personally troubled by massive students' resentment, Dhaka University Vice-Chancellor Prof Anwarulah Chowdhury at last admitted "indecent behaviour" with the girl students of Shamsunnahar Hall and promised stern actions against those responsible.

"Whoever involved with the filthy behaviour with my 'daughters' in Shamsunnahar Hall, I want to make it clear that I am determined to take stringent measures against him/her, or those," the beleaguered VC said in a statement on Monday.

Though he came up with his late realisation of the brutal police assault on the Shamsunnahar Hall, Prof Chowdhury still reckoned the students' demonstration as provocative activities with a plot to destabilise the university's academic atmosphere.

The VC claimed that in his 35 years at Dhaka University, no question arose about his role in the past. "A vested quarter is shaping to tarnish my image and make me controversial over an untoward incident," he said.

Referring to the judicial inquiry commission on the incident, he urged the government to take action against those found responsible for the incident as per the commission's report. "If the commission accuses me, I am ready to accept that," he added.

His statement continues: Before identifying those involved with the incident through an accurate and impartial investigation, it is totally unwanted to making derogatory remarks or statements against a teacher seated at the university's top post.
