

## Irregular admission in Kushtia Polytech Instt alleged

KUSHTIA, Oct 6:—A tense situation is prevailing in Kushtia Polytechnic Institute concerning the admission of 29 Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) activists.

It is alleged that some JCD leaders and a group of teachers admitted 29 students taking ten thousand taka each from the students as bribe.

The college authority said there are 220 seats under five departments of the institute, 191 students were admitted this year from the merit list. Rest 29 seats were vacant. In the meantime a group of JCD leaders created pressure upon the college principal that at least 50 cadres of JCD will have to be admitted.

On the mid night of October 2, the institute authority completed the admission of 29 students according to the choice of JCD leaders. Later, the students who were in the 1st waiting list came to know the incident and brought out
