

DU student give 7-day ultimatum

Giving a seven-day ultimatum to the Dhaka University authorities for reopening the university, the demonstrating students threatened to go for further movement from the following day.

The Students' Against Repression, the banner under which the recent student upsurge took place, announced it on Saturday while submitting a memorandum to the acting Vice Chancellor Prof AFM Yusuf Haider at his office.

The students submitted the memorandum demanding immediate reopening of the university and implementation of the rest demands of their seven-point charter.

Receiving the memorandum the acting VC and acting Proctor Prof ASM Atiqur Rahman sat in a dialogue with the general students' representatives.

Prof Haider said some of their demands were already fulfilled and the others were in progress.

The paramilitary BDR forces have already withdrawn from the campus, the acting VC told the students and announced that new schedule will be announced soon for those who failed to appear in the examinations scheduled for July 24.

Referring to the students' another demand the acting VC said the authorities will take initiatives to amend outdated Proctorial Laws of the university.
