

Teachers recruitment
Candidates call
hartal in Sylhet
on July 13

SYLHET, July 5:—The candidates, who sat in written test for recruitment of teachers in the government primary schools of Sylhet division, have announced a series of agitation programmes demanding withdrawal of the government decision to cancel the test, reports UNB.

As part of the programmes, they will enforce a dawn-to-dusk hartal in Sylhet on July 13. The other programmes include holding rally, press conference and mass contact.

The programmes were finalised at a meeting held at Suleman Hall here today. A 51-member committee was also formed in the meeting aimed at continuing the movement until fulfilment of their demand.

The written test of the candidates for recruitment of Assistant Teachers in the government schools was held on June 14. But later on, the authorities concerned cancelled the test due to leakage of question papers in some districts.

The candidates in the meeting said question papers were not leaked out in the division. "Why we will have to bear the liability for it?" they argued.

Some 1,220 posts of assistant teacher were lying vacant in various government primary schools in four districts of the division.
