## New system for DU admission

Students seeking admission to the first year honours classes of the University of Dacca for the session 1978-79, under the Faculties of Arts, Social Science, Commerce, Law and B. Sc. pass course in Industrial Arts Group may apply to the Chairman of the department concerned and Dean of the Faculty Science (in the case of Industrial Arts Group only) in a plain paper on or before October 17.

Candidates having at least one second division in SSC or HSC examination, with a total number of 430 marks (without grace) in HSC is eligible to apply for admission. The candidate must have at least 45 per cent marks in the HSC examination in the subject he wishes to study or in an approved allied subject.

There would be no admission test. The students would be selected for the allotted seats from a merit list prepared on the basis of 40 per cent of total marks obtained by candidates in SSC and 60 per cent of total marks obtained in the HSC examinations.

In addition to other requirement, candidates for admission into the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication should have at least 50 per cent marks either in English or Bengali.

Notification for admission in to the faculties of Science and Biological Sciences will be issued in due course.
