

PM calls for total unity of students

Prime Minister Shah Azizur Rahman on Tuesday called for total unity of the students and avoiding the politics of violence reports BSS.

He was distributing certificates among a group of students on conclusion of their two-day training course on politics and social science in Dacca. The training course was organised by Bangladesh Nationalist Party's (BNP) political and social science training centre.

The Prime Minister recalled the history of the student movements in the sub-continent and said in all the democratic and the liberation struggle students were in the fore front.

Shah Aziz urged the student leaders to provide intellectual leadership to their community with a correct sense of direction. The Prime Minister called upon the students to acquire knowledge in accordance with the need of the time and age.

He said during the Awami League rule 20,000 students and youths were killed.

Shah Aziz hoped that the

students having been trained from this centre would work for the welfare of the people.

Another message says: An eight-member delegation from Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology Officers' Association on Tuesday called on Prime Minister Shah Azizur Rahman at his secretariat chamber.
