Technical-biased education system stressed

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Prime Minister Shah Azizur Rahman said in Dacca on Monday that the whole system of education would have to be technical-biased and the Government was working hard to introduce the system at earliest possible time, reports BSS.

Speaking at the formal inauguration of College of Engineering in Dacca, the Prime Minister called upon the engineers and technicians to extend their whole-hearted co-operation for the successful implementation of the Second Five-Year Plan. He said vocational training institute would be established in each police station and arrangements were underway to impart vocational training in the primary schools.

Presided over by Education Secretary Kazi Fazlur Rahman, the inaugural function was also addressed by Mr. Hamid Ali Shah, Director Technical Education, Mr. Mahbubul Islam, a student and Mr. Haider Ali, a teacher of the college.

The college presently housed in Technical Teachers Training College is affiliated to Dacca University and has an enrollment of 120 students. It will confer BSC Engineering Degree after completion of three course.

Diploma engineers are eligible for admission into the college. With three departments—Civil, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering, the college started functioning from first July, 1980.

Shah Aziz said for the last 18 years, diploma engineers had been struggling for the establishment of this college and

expressed his satisfaction in inaugurating the institution. He said work on the Taka 8.90 crore project for this college was progressing at Joydebpur and it was expected to be completed by a further one and a half year.

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
