

Education to be free by '95, says Mahbub

Education Minister Mahbubur Rahman said in Dhaka on Thursday that the Government of President Ershad wanted to make education free at all level by 1995, reports BSS.

He was inaugurating a two-day national conference of Bangladesh Government Secondary School Teachers Association at Teachers' Training College auditorium.

Mr. Mahbub pointed out that the right of education had been guaranteed under the Constitution and said the present government was doing its best to make the education facilities available to all without discrimination and disparity.

Presided over by Mr. Mohammad Abdul Bari, President of the association, the conference was addressed among others by General Secretary Mohammad Shahidur Rahman and Abul Hasan Farooque.
