

HC orders re-evaluation of SSC script

THE High Court on Monday directed the Chittagong education board authorities to re-examine an SSC examinee's mathematics answer-script in presence of a school teacher and the student within three days as there was an allegation of technical glitch in the computer while making the result sheets.

A bench of Justice Syed Muhammad Dastagir Husain and Justice AKM Shahidul Haq also issued a rule asking the authorities to explain why the student's

result would not be republished after the re-evaluation.

The father of the examinee Mayeesha Farzana in a writ petition told the court that her daughter was deprived of A+ grade mark in mathematics as the board on average gave A grade mark to examinees, who answered C and D set of multiple questions of mathematics, because of technical glitch.

The education secretary, chairman of the Chittagong Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, the examination controller

and the board's inspector (school) and Dr Khastagir Government Girls' High School's headmaster were asked to respond to the rule within three weeks.

A total of 95 SSC students of the school, obtained A+ in all but mathematics, and their guardians demonstrated demanding re-evaluation of mathematics answer sheets after the results of the SSC and equivalent examinations were published on May 11.
