

Education alone can ensure progress: Zafar

Prime Minister Kazi Zafar Ahmed said in Dhaka on Saturday that education alone could ensure our national progress. It can also help transform the burden of population into human resource, he said, reports BSS.

The Prime Minister while addressing the students of Habibullah Bahar College said, "unless illiteracy is removed from the society, over-all development of 11-crore people of a country of 55 thousand square miles is not only an arduous task, it is impossible also."

The function, on the occasion of the reception of the freshers to the institution was also addressed by State Minister for Religious Affairs Kazi Mofazzal Hossain Kaikobad, JP Parliamentary Party Whip Monirul Huq Chowdhury and the Principal of the college Tahazzad Hussain.

Kazi Zafar Ahmed said from the
