

Zafar's call to carry nation forward

DHAKA, Sept 16 (BSS): Prime Minister Kazi Zafar Ahmed today called upon the meritorious students of the country to be prepared to carry the nation forward.

He said "the nation expects her best posterity to shoulder the task of nation-building activities ably and boldly."

The Prime Minister was addressing a function held at Vikarunnisa School and College auditorium to accord a reception to the students who secured positions in the merit list from the institution in S S C examinations in 1990 and 1989.

Kazi Zafar Ahmed said, "the Government of President Ershad was totally committed to eradicate malpractices from the examination hall once for all. He said the name of President Ershad would go down in history for bringing about a number of revolutionary changes in the education system of the country."

The function was followed by a cultural programme.
