Longterm plan taken to check copying in public exam.

THAKURGAON, June 20—A lecturer of Gareya College, Md. Abdus Samad, who was wounded seriously by a terrorist for expelling an examinee for adopting unfair means in the last HSC Examinations was honoured and awarded by the Rajshahi Education Board Authority.

A brief function was held at Thakurgaon Circuit House on June 17. Organized by District Administration the function was presided over by Jalal Ahmed, Deputy Commissioner, Prof. Md. Nazrul Islam, Chairman, Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board, Rajshahi was present as the chief guest and Md. Fazlur Rahman, Deputy Controller of Board was present as the special guest.

Prof. Nazrul Islam said that in resisting mass unfair means Abdus Samad played a valiant role. He lauded his role in combating mass unfair means and said that the teacher community would have to play the main role in combating mass unfair means. The Govt, the Education Board, the Civil and Police administration would help the teacher community in this regard. The Education Board Authority instantly stood by the side of wounded teachers and it would be continued.

He further said that for checking mass unfair means long term plan would have to be taken for the improvement of class room teaching and holding of fair examinations are the main things. He also said that he would try for a state honour for Samad.

In his presidential address, the Deputy Commissioner said that in

the last HSC examination mass copying was checked to a great extent by the joint effort of the Govt, its Civil and Police Administrations and the teachers community. He informed the meeting that the terrorist examinee Dipen Chandra Sarker who hit Samad was given detention for one month and it would be extended for three months and he has requested the Police to prepare the charge sheet of the case as early as possible for trial. He also said that in the HSC examination in the district 3,000 examinees out of 14,000 were either expelled or dropped the examination for taking tight measures in checking unfair means.

Md. Abul Hossain, ADC (Gen); Mozahedul Karim, Principal, Salandar College and General Secretary, Bangladesh College Teachers Association, Thakurgaon District Committee; Md. Saifur Rahman, Principal Gareya College; Md. Shafiqul Islam, General Secretary, Bangladesh College Teachers Association, Thakurgaon Sadar Upazila Committee and Principal Syed Merajul Hossain, President, Thakurgaon Press Club, spoke in the meeting.

Later Prof. Nazrul Islam handed over a cheque of Taka 10,000 to Md. Abdus Samad. Earlier the Board Authority gave Tk 10,000 for his treatment.

It may be mentioned here Abdus Samad was wounded seriously when an expelled HSC examinee Dipen Chandra Sarker hit on his forehead by a hammer for expelling him on the first day of the HSC examination.
