

Police swooped CU halls, 17 outsiders nabbed

CHITTAGONG, May 16: Majority of the gents dormitories of Chittagong University went under a series of pre-dawn raids today and the raiders nabbed 17 people on charges of unauthorized staying at the dorms and their

assumed involvement in the campus violence on Thursday. Police officials claimed that they went to the dormitories at about 12:00 a.m. and conducted raids until 4:30 a.m. Cops also rounded up 17

people from the dorms and subsequently took them to Hathazari police station for questioning.

A spokesman of the university said that the security people had been advised to

carry out raids at the dorms to confirm no hideout of the outsiders and culprits there mainly in the wake of eruption of violence on the campus.

Both the probe bodies formed to detect the Thursday's violence and reconciliation between the student organizations for the sake of maintaining congenial atmosphere, have reportedly started operation today.

On the other hand, Thursday's campus violence scared the ordinary resident students. The scared students are quitting the dorms and the on campus cottages to avoid hazards of similar violence that may occur at any time.

Mohammad Monir Hossain, a student of Political Science Department, who lived at a cottage on campus, said they had always been at risk of crossfire. He feared recurrence of similar bloody clashes as the two arch rivals the BCL and the ICS men had been at loggerhead over establishing supremacy on the campus.
