

Madrasas not honoring nat'l policies to face action

A parliamentary body asked the Madrasa Education Board Chairman to identify and take action against the madrasas refraining from performing national anthem, hoisting the national flag and hanging portraits of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, reports UNB.

The parliamentary standing committee on government assurances in its 3rd meeting at Sangsad Bhaban Sunday issued the directive for action against the Islamic educational institutions not

complying with the new government's executive order approved by the cabinet.

Committee President M Fazole Rabbi Miah presided over the meeting.

Fazole Rabbi Miah also the chief of the parliamentary probe body that has indicted former speaker, barrister Jamiruddin Sircar, his deputy Akhtar Haqid Siddiqui and ex-chief whip Khandaker Delwar Hossain for financial irregularities during their tenure.

The meeting also reviewed the implementation of the

assurances given during the 7th and 8th parliaments and the 1st session of the 9th parliament on different issues under the Ministries of Education, Environment and Forest, and Power, Energy and Mineral Resources.

Each of the committees of Planning Commission and ministries concerned also placed their recommendations for necessary initiatives for approving and implementing the projects under the ministries on priority basis to build up a digital
