

JU teachers lock up VC's office

JAHANGIRNAGAR University teachers who have been rallying for a few months under the banner of Shikkhak Samaj on the campus on Thursday locked up the office of the vice-chancellor Shariff Enamul Kabir for two hours demanding his resignation. The vice-chancellor was not present in the office.

Classes were not held at most of the departments for the two hours when the teachers sat in front of the vice-chancellor's office.

The teachers are holding protests as part of their six-day programme to press home the resignation of the

vice-chancellor, as he had failed to meet their eight-point demands.

The demand includes trial of Zubair's killing, formation of a committee to find out the reasons for criminal activities on the campus, congenial campus environment and an end to recruitment of teachers on political considerations.

The teachers, who rallied in front the office of the vice-chancellor, also had a discussion at the place where the speakers criticised irregularities of the vice-chancellor and the university administration.

They said that the vice-chancellor had no right to remain in the post as he is still patronising BCL activists said to have killed Zubair.

Zubair Ahmed, a fourth-year student of English, was tortured by the Chhatra League activists on January 8 and he died from his injuries in United Hospital early January 9.

The Jahangirnagar University Teachers' Association president, AA Mamun, said that tougher programmes would be announced if the vice-chancellor did not resign.
