

JU protest continues over assault on staff

JAHANGIRNAGAR. University employees continued their protest, demanding resignation of a teacher on accusation of instigating students to assault a staff.

The demonstrators besieged the register building and locked up class rooms at different departments Saturday morning, protesting the Wednesday's assault incident.

Later, the agitators brought out procession from administrative building that ended in a rally at the same place under the banners of JU Employees' Union and JU Employees' Association.

Speakers demanded immediate dismissal of the teacher and threatened

tougher agitation if the demand was not met.

Ehteshamul Haque Minu, an assistant staff of biological sciences faculty, was assaulted by some students of environmental science department allegedly at the behest of Mostafijur Rahman, a lecturer of the department.

The employees earlier had met with the vice-chancellor to press for immediate punishment of the accused teacher.

JU Employees Union Secretary told this correspondent that the university buses would not move today if authority failed to meet their demand by Saturday.

JU register Abu Bakkar Siddique said JU authorities on Wednesday formed a body to probe the incident.
