

Pry, Ebtedayee terminal exams begin tomorrow

THE Primary and Ebtedayee Terminal Examinations 2012 begin across the country on Wednesday.

Some 26.41 lakh students under general education and 3.28 lakh students under madrasah education will take part in the examinations

to be held simultaneously in 482 upazilas of all the districts.

Besides, there will be a few overseas centres where the children of expatriates and employees of Bangladesh embassies and high commissions will sit for the exams.

Shyamal Kanti Ghosh, director general of the Directorate of Primary Education, disclosed this to the news agency at his office on Monday afternoon.

He said all preparations have already been made to hold the Primary and Ebtedayee Terminal Examinations in a fair atmosphere.

The six-day examination will end on November 29.

Shyamal informed that Primary and Mass education minister M Afsarul Ameen will address the media at the ministry on Tuesday to present the details of the Primary and Ebtedayee Terminal Examinations.

Sources at the ministry said mathematics exams under general education will

be held on the first day on Wednesday.

The following are the schedules of other primary exams:

Bangle on November 22, English on November 26, Paribesh Parichiti Somaj on November 27, Paribesh Parichiti Bigyan (Science) and Arabic on November 28 and Dhar-mo (Religion), Quran O Tajbeed and Aaka'id O Fikah on November 29.

Directorate of Primary Education DG said, as in last year, the exams

will be held every day from 11:00am to 1:00pm.

He added that the physically challenged students will get extra 20 minutes in addition to the stipulated time.
