

Non-govt pry teachers to lock up schools today, tomorrow

TEACHERS of registered non-government primary schools across the country will lock up their schools today and tomorrow demanding nationalisation of their job, teachers said.

'We will lock up all the schools across the country today and tomorrow and we sit in front of the schools,' Shamsul Alam, chairman of the National Non-Government Primary Teachers' United Alliance, told New Age on Saturday.

He said that they would continue with the movement until their demand was met.
