

# JU suspends 37 students

Jahangirnagar University authorities at a syndicate meeting yesterday suspended 37 students for different periods in connection with five incidents.

Twenty two students were suspended for three months on charge of stalking women on February 22.

Four activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League JU unit were suspended on charge of beating up three Bangladesh National Cadet Corps and Rover Scouts on February 27.

Of the four, two were suspended for one year and the others for six months.

Four students were suspended over kidnapping Md Ahsan Habib Prince, lecturer at Alhaz Selima Rahman Vocational College, on January 15.

Three BCL JU unit activists were suspended over a factional clash between students of Maulana Bhashani Hall and Shaheed Rafiq Jabbar Hall.

Four BCL JU unit activists were suspended over a factional clash during an admission test on October 13, 2012. Of them, two were suspended for one year while the other two for six months.

Meanwhile, Jahangirnagar University Teachers' Association announced a 5-day protest programme as the vice-chancellor did not meet their demand for expulsion of a BCL JU unit leader over allegedly assaulting a teacher on April 6.

The association alleged BCL JU unit general secretary Rajib Ahmed attacked Nurul Haque, a JU teacher and also syndicate member. However, BCL JU unit denied the allegation.
