

Over 1,500 SSC examinees vow to resist corruption

Over 1,500 SSC examinees of 2008 of 22 schools in Dhaka on Saturday took a strong vow against corruption at a daylong function held here at Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Centre, reports BSS.
