



## JCD strike continues

# DU exams postponed, BCL rally today

The third day of the nonstop shutdown in Dhaka University by BNP's student wing Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) passed off peacefully on Tuesday.

No classes and examinations were held and the offices except the Administrative Building remained closed. The university transport was suspended during the strike.

Campus sources said some JCD activists harassed some students studying in the Science Library in the afternoon.

The University Syndicate in an emergency meeting postponed all the examinations scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday so as to prepare for the much-talked about inspection.

The authorities earlier decided to form teams led by Provost of each hall to inspect the arrangements to reinstate the genuine students to their respective halls. The team will go round respective halls simultaneously on the same day and throw out outsiders occupying the rooms with the help of law enforcing

agencies. But the date is yet to be fixed.

Only valid identity card holders will be allowed to be residing in the halls after the inspection, the meeting decided.

The authorities have called an emergency meeting of the members of the university Senate, Syndicate, Teachers' Association, Deans, Provosts, Departmental Chairmen, Directors, Proctorial Body today (Wednesday) to discuss on the campus situation.

Sources said the possible date of the inspection would be fixed in the next meeting.

JCD leaders at campus demonstrations stuck to their demand for the Vice Chancellor's resignation, rehabilitation of the bonafide JCD supporters in dormitories and arresting the "armed goons of BCL". The leaders vowed to continue the strike till their demands were not met.

JCD held a reception for the just-released three leaders from jail.

BCL will hold a rally at DU Battala demanding implementation of court verdict in Bangabandhu murder case. From the rally the BCL leaders will give an ultimatum to the strike callers till today (Wednesday) and said they would not allow any "non-student and terrorist" bid to enforce student strike on the university campus.

Some students under the banner

of "general students" brought out a procession against the strike.

Meanwhile, the Mohsin Hall area was rocked by bomb blasts on Monday night creating panic among the students and injuring a suspected carrier of the explosives.

Police said the carrier, identified as rickshawpuller Aminul (24), charged three bombs at the southeastern corner of the hall and another two at the northwestern corner at about 9:30 pm.

During the second-time charging, he suffered splinter injury in his belly and was caught red-handed by students. They beat him indiscriminately and handed over to police.

Hailed from Chandpur, Aminul was a canteen boy of Mohsin Hall during the rule of BNP government, and now he pulls rickshaw in and around the campus.

BCL leaders accused the JCD supporters for hiring Aminul to hurl the bombs.
