

BCL leader's hand severed in Mymensingh

WRIST of a local leader of Bangladesh Chhatra League was severed by miscreants in Nandail upazila in Mymensingh on Thursday.

The injured, Parvez Azad Shohag, is the vice-president of Nandail unit of BCL. He is now undergoing treatment at Pangu Hospital in the capital.

Shohag's brother, Raqibul Azad Sajib, said a group of miscreants stabbed Shohag at his back and left hand when he was going home from party office on Thursday evening.

The incident occurred a few yards away from Nandail police station, he said.

His left wrist was severed and he needed some 70 stitches at his back, he added.

Local people rushed Shohag to Nandail Upazila Health Complex and later shifted him to Mymensingh Medical College. But he was referred to Pangu Hospital as his condition deteriorated.

Sajib said Shohag had rebuked some party activists on Thursday morning over taking drugs. The attack occurred later on the day.

Nandail police officer-in-charge, Ataur Rahman, said no case was filed in this connection as the victim's family did not lodge any complaint.

Sajib said they did not file any case as they were busy with the treatment of his brother.
