

PRIMARY TEACHERS' EXAM *Man jailed for adopting unfair means*

A MOBILE court sentenced an examinee to one year imprisonment as he adopted unfair means in the primary school teachers' recruitment test on Friday.

The man was wearing a wig with a hidden microphone in it and that his question paper was being solved from outside through a mobile phone, a mobile court judge said.

The man was identified as Mursalin, 25, son of Toyeb Ali of Suranpur village of Bholahat upazila in Chapainawabganj.

The judge of the mobile court, executive magistrate Ranukrishna Barman, said, Mursalin appeared in the examination at the Shah Neyamatullah College centre in the town, wearing a wig.

Barman said he suspect-

ed the man for his unusual appearance and approached him to check his admit card. He then discovered that the photo he had given with the application form did not match with his face.

Barman said he then found a wire was fitted into his shirt and went to his underwear. At the top end of the wire, there was a microphone put in his ear cups.

The executive magistrate said it appeared that he was being helped by someone whom the court could not locate.

The court then convicted him of indulging in unethical means in the exam.

Chapainawabganj district primary education officer Dilruba Begum said a total of 13,725 candidates appeared in the recruitment exam against 144 posts for assistant teachers in the district.
