

Nahid advocates moral studies into teacher training manual

EDUCATION minister Nazrul Islam Nahid proposed on Tuesday that moral studies should be incorporated into training manual of teachers to curb unethical activities carried out by a quarter of teachers.

Some teachers illegally help students with answers of multiple choice questions in public exams. Many teachers do not pay due attention to the classroom duties as they are much engaged in coaching business, said the minister while addressing a workshop in capital.

National Academy for Educational Management organised the workshop

on preparing manual for training of professors and principals colleges at its office.

On Monday, a Detective Branch team arrested Nazmul Hasan and Kamrul, three teachers of Gulam Mostafa Model College of Demra in the capital, for their alleged involvement in leaking HSC examination questions.

'These teachers are the black sheep among teachers. We will take stern action against them,' Nahid said.

'We can incorporate moral studies in the training manual of teachers that can motivate them to keep themselves away from such illegal works,' he added.

'Teachers should live an exemplary life and students should imitate them. This is really unfortunate that some of them are engaged in such heinous act,' Nahid added.

Deputy commissioners, while talking with education and primary and mass education ministers at DC conference on July 27, had alleged that a numbers of teachers illegally help students with answers of multiple choice questions of public exams.

Education secretary Nazrul Islam Khan said matters like education administration and new education technology should be incorporated in the training manual.
