

Nizami stresses on quality education

PABNA, Jan 17.—Agriculture Minister and Jamaat-e-Islami chief Motiur Rahman Nizami today said there was no alternative to quality education to withstand the current competitiveness of globalisation, reports BSS.

"We need well educated, skilled and enlightened youths to withstand the rigors of globalisation," he told a function staged to mark the opening of the newly constructed primary school building at Santhia upazila here.

Nizami also stressed the need for co-ordinated endeavours of teachers and guardians to ensure quality education in the country.

Additional Deputy Commissioner (Education) Noyan Chandra Banerjee, amir of district unit of Jamaat-e-Islami Prof. Abdur Rahim, thana nirbahi officer Sultan Abdul Hamid and local four-party alliance leaders were present at the function of the Asfra Ideal Academy Primary School.

The Agriculture Minister urged the students to attain technological knowledge along with the academic curriculum from to fulfil the demand of the 21st century.
